The fund continues as natural disasters affect members. Contributions demonstrate the Society's "genuine spiritual fellowship." Members who sustain major losses from floods, tornadoes, hurricanes, earthquakes, wildfires and other natural disasters may be recommended by their chapter and state organization presidents to receive U.S. \$500 from the DKG Emergency Fund.

Chapters can receive points toward the Maycie Award for Chapter Excellence by making a contribution to the Emergency Fund, along with other causes that fall under the DKGIEF.
